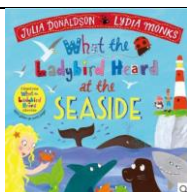


EYFS Home learning project – week beginning 22/6/2020

Below are some ideas that you could do/make about What the Ladybird Heard at the Seaside for our home learning project. Literacy

- Can you practice forming your letters in the sand? Or make them in playdough?
- Can you find the rhyming words in the story and then think of any other words that can rhyme?
- Can you create a wanted poster for Lanky Len and Hefty Hugh? What descriptive words could you use?
- Can you describe the mermaid using sentences (either written or verbal)?
- Can you retell the story? Or verbally to a grown up?
- Can you write a story of what might the ladybird heard next?

Mathematics

- Can you count how many animals are in the story?
- Can you double and half using spots on a lady bird?
- Can you explore water using different types of buckets? Talking about capacity?
- Can you make shells and put numbers on them to 20. Can you put the right amount of jewels on the shell?



Other Activities

- Why do you think the ladybird told the animals about Lanky Len and Hefty Hugh?
- Can you find out information about the life cycle of a ladybird?
- Can you find out information about a ladybird? Seal? Whale? What interesting facts have you found out?
- Can you create a seaside picture? What animals would you put on it? Or a poster on how to stay safe at the seaside.
- Can you explore what sinks and floats?
- Can you make a seaside in a jar?
- Can you move like a dolphin? Can you complete the under the water yoga?
