



Year 2 Summer Home Learning Menu

Following on from the recent weekly home learning schedules, we have created a menu of lessons/activities which will help to further prepare pupils for a September return to school. Please do not upload any work to Class Dojo as this will not be accessed by teachers due to class groups being updated over the Summer break.



Writing

Here is a collection of ideas for engaging writing opportunities:

- Keep a journal of what is happening day to day, how you are filling your time and how you are feeling. You could draw a picture to illustrate each day.
- Letter writing - If you are missing your friends or family members could you write them a letter explaining what you have been doing and how you're feeling. If they live nearby then you could go and post it, or put it in the letter box. If not ask your grown-ups to send it as an email for you.
- Write a poem - You could write a poem about summer, school, your feelings or anything else that inspires you.
- Write a fact file about something that interests you. Research it on the internet and find out as many fascinating facts as you can. What is the silliest fact that you can find? What is the most interesting fact? The most shocking fact?
- We are living through history right now. Capture the moment by making a time capsule. Write a letter to children of the future. Talk about friends, TV programmes, hobbies, what is going on in the world, what you would like to be when you grow up, how you feel right now – anything that you think a child in the future would want to know about. If you have one, use a newspaper to cut out articles that you think would be relevant. Take some pictures of today and print them out. Put it all together in a lunchbox or scrapbook and hide it up in the loft or bury it in the garden.

Maths



- Carol Vorderman 'The Maths Factor', free online maths sessions for children aged between 4 and 11. Click [here](#).
- Can you measure all of the ingredients for your favourite cake, using grams and kilograms, and millilitres? Can you order the ingredients from the smallest to the largest quantity? Or the largest to the smallest?
- If you make a cake, explore the idea of fractions, by cutting the cake into pieces and noticing for example that $\frac{2}{4}$ is the same as $\frac{1}{2}$, before eating it!
- If your child cannot already, try and teach each them to tell the time – o'clock, quarter past, half past, quarter to.
- Find up to 10 objects in your house / garden and use a ruler or a tape measure to measure their height. Can you order the objects from tallest to smallest, or smallest to tallest? Which is the middle measurement? Are any of your objects the same size?
- Maths word problems – Maths is more challenging for the children when it forms part of a story or a narrative and the calculation is not obvious.
