#### Social Distancing

Around school, we have a one-way system. This is so there is minimal contact between parents walking their children to and from school. I have had concerns from some parents that not everyone is following this school safety measure. I realise, walking the full distance around school adds an extra minute to people's journey, however, I insist that we all follow the rules for our own safety. I will be stood by the path to check that this continues to happen next week.



### Water Bottles

Please can I remind parents to send their child to school with a filled water bottle. This will be returned at the end of each day to be washed and refilled for the next day. We cannot use cups in school to provide water so it is an important item to remember.

#### School Dinners

We have noticed that some children are swapping between school dinners and packed lunches during the week. Unfortunately this is not permitted, children must remain on the same pattern, with the exception that packed lunch children can join us for a school dinner on a Friday. If you wish to change your child's dinner pattern, please speak to the school office who will confirm when this can start. In addition, school dinners must be paid for in advance, preferably weekly. If your circumstances have recently changed and you wish to apply for free school meals, please speak to the school office who can provide you with a form, or send you the link to apply online.

We ask that your child does not come to school if they display one or more of the following symptoms:

- A persistent dry cough
- A raised prolonged temperature
- Your child loses their sense of taste and smell.

If you or one of your household are symptomatic and is currently waiting for the outcome of a test – your whole household must isolate until there is a negative outcome.
