School Re-opening

We have finally reached the last day of lockdown for our school. Next week we are fully open and fully operational. We are all genuinely excited and thrilled to be welcoming everyone back. I am sure the children are looking forward to seeing their friends and teachers, and you as parents are looking forward to claiming back your time also!

In my communication on Monday 1st March, I described in detail what the full re-opening would look like. As you would expect we have a robust risk assessment in place and the necessary mitigating controls to ensure our staff, pupils and community are as safe as possible as we move towards the easing of the national restrictions. You have a big part to play in keeping us all safe and ensuring that we can get back to the business of educating our wonderful children. Below are a set of reminders about our non-negotiable expectations for Monday. Please forgive me for any repetition in my communication about health and safety and attendance, but I want everyone to be on the 'same page' from Monday 8th March.

- The school is open for ALL our children on 8th March and attendance is compulsory. Senior leaders will be communicating with any families where there are absences for unknown reasons. I cannot stress enough the intrinsic correlation between pupil progress in all areas of their development and attendance. As adults, it is our responsibility to ensure they get the education that they fully deserve.
- Breakfast provision, for those who have booked it, will recommence. After school clubs will be phased back in over the course of the academic year.
- Pupils are expected to be in full uniform on their return to school. On the days where they have PE lessons they may wear their PE kit into school and bring a change of footwear with them if necessary. These days will be communicated to you by the class teachers in due course.
- We expect parents and carers to consider the safety of others when circulating our school, to drop off and pick up their children. Social distancing measures are in place around the school. Please do not take offence if you are gently challenged to stay 2m apart. This is to keep all of our community safe and ensure no one feels that there is unnecessary risk when bringing or collecting children from their educational setting.
- We will be contacting families with the arrangements regarding remote learning for those pupils that are required to shield or who are required to isolate at home from 8th March. Remote learning will be offered to these children ONLY. All other children, with the exception of those who are genuinely ill, should be in school.
- Finally, if you have already not done so, can you return any devices the school provided you with to support remote learning over the lockdown period.

World Book Day – Thursday 4th March

We had such an incredible day yesterday celebrating World Book Day 2021! Reading is at the heart of our entire school curriculum so this day is always a special one in our school calendar.
