Reception – Term 4



English

In English, we will be reading 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar', 'Erroll's Garden', 'Usborne Lifecycles' and 'Jack and the Beanstalk'.

Each week, your child will receive a QR code for the book that we are reading so that you can read along with us!

During this half-term, we will focus on writing a short sentence. We will also be focusing on letter formation.

At home, practice writing a short sentence using finger spaces.

Expressive Arts and Design As artists, we will be looking at work by Georgia O'Keefe. Can you complete an observational drawing at home?

As inventors, we will be exploring types of fruit. We will be making a delicious fruit salad.

Make a list of all the ingredients and equipment you would need to make a fruit salad.

As musicians, we will be listening to Folk music.

Maths

In maths, we will review the composition of numbers 6-9. Children will also explore how 10 can be composed. We will count objects accurately. We will recall doubling facts.

Ask your child to write doubling facts to 10.

Physical Development

This term, children will be taking part in ball skills. In this unit, children will develop their ball skills through the topic of 'minibeasts'. Children will develop fundamental ball skills such as: rolling and receiving the ball, throwing to a target, bouncing and catching, dribbling with their feet and kicking a ball.
